Shallow basket (*imbenge*) made of wrapped telephone wire - a traditional Zulu grass basketry technique using a new material. The basket incorporates HIV/AIDS prevention messages.

Traditional Zulu style beaded necklace made by artist Tholiwe Sithole from Muden, Msinga region of the KwaZulu Natal province of South Africa. The design uses the AIDS symbol.



Doll made by Zulu artist Lolilile Ximba in 2003. This four-foot high doll, made of fabric, wire, beadwork, and wearing child's sneakers, represents a Zulu woman in traditional dress. She wears a beadwork pin with the AIDS ribbon, as a way to promote awareness and prevention of the virus.
